WW1 Centenary - 2018 Event - The Parish Council will be hosting a meeting in September to generate ideas for the celebrations to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of World War 1. The meeting will be open to all village organisations or individuals who would like to be involved. The provisional date is 12th September, tbc when the venue is fixed. More in next month's issue.

Tree works in the conservation area – A gentle reminder that any work to trees within the conservation area requires permission from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council.

All trees over 7.5cm in diameter when measured at 1.5m from ground level are protected in a conservation area. It is an offence to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or destroy a tree without the council's permission in a conservation area.

Conservation Area Review - Public Consultation - The Kingsclere Conservation Area, which is designated to protect the architectural and historic interest of the village, has been in place since 1969. From time to time it is important to review appraisals of conservation areas, and Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council has a duty to do so.



Parking - I am continuing to receive complaints regarding parking on the pavement, double yellow lines and grass verges.

Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs, people with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs. Please remember the pavement is for pedestrians and not vehicles. Pedestrians should not have to walk in the road and put themselves in danger in order to pass something blocking the pavement. Furthermore you must not park or wait on double yellows lines.

To report any parking complaints please contact Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council.

You should always call 999 when it is an emergency, such as when a crime is in progress, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.



Nature Notes

Our first cuckoo was heard whilst walking in the Clatfords on 21st June which is a sad item to report and indicates the decline in numbers of one of the



A follow-up ref. the tern raft on our local lakes: a complete success with both chicks fledged and seen, with the parent birds, circling over the water.

All sorts of crops are grown these days as diversification by farmers and we can often name them but one recently had us stumped. It was medium height, broad leafed and rather beanlike and was, we were informed, soya bean. Soya has so many uses but mainly flour, milk, oil and the residue can be fed to livestock.

> Bullfinches visiting the garden were unexpected but a pair is now seen daily on the sunflower feeder, perched on the rim of a shallow dish beneath the feeder, taking seeds from the hopper and also spilled seed

> > from the dish. Further reading revealed that their diet includes seeds and berries when shoots and buds are exhausted. Each seed is

held in the stout black bill and milled round and round until the husk cracks and the heart eaten.

An unidentified bird calling from the cover of a barley crop locally had us mystified. By good fortune a knowledgeable "birder" at the same location confirmed it as a quail. Quail are our only migratory game bird and are classed as a scarce migrant much persecuted by trapping en route. These tiny birds are more often more likely heard than seen.


