

Nature Notes

The designation of Spring by the Meteorological Office as March 1st is an invitation for the elements to shout, 'Oh no it's not' and to batter these isles with everything they have in their armoury. Traditionalists still prefer to wait until



the 21st.of the month to think of Spring, which is roughly in line with the Equinox and to be aware of the old adage of March coming in like a lion; let us hope that the last part of the saying; going out like a lamb, holds true.

Large flocks of geese settled onto the pasture at The Vyne, Canada geese on the upper part and Graylags below and a clear gap between the two. It seems probable that high numbers involved dictated clan loyalty which is not always the case and we often see a few graylags quite happy in the company of their N. American cousins. The occasional sight of a hybrid shows that sometimes fraternisation reaches a new level among some birds.

A resident alerted us to a strange sight locally. The plants on a roadside bank with a field beyond were festooned with a grey sheet of web which stretched along the road for many yards. Long strings of the same material connected the taller plant stems. Further into the field the same thing covered a patch of a low growing crop. Sheets of gossamer seen on dewy autumn morning are the work of spiders but what would they achieve on a cold February morning when supplies of insects are low? Was it even the work of spiders? A mystery!

It was good to see a song thrush in the garden recently and broken shells of snails lying on a flagstone, evidence of its meal.

Mozart - Requiem

Janet Wheeler – I Sing and Ever Shall

with

New London Sinfonia

Conductor – David Gibson

Mozart's magnificent 'Requiem' is a work shrouded in mystery. Beset by ill-health in the summer of 1791, Mozart was visited by a 'mysterious man in grey' who commissioned this work on condition of the utmost secrecy. This person, we now know was employed by Count von Wazlegg-Stuppach, a keen amateur musician, whose wife had died earlier that year. The Count's intention was to try and pass the work off as his own and dedicate it to his wife, hence the need for secrecy. Unfortunately, when Mozart died in December that year the work was incomplete. It was finished by Franz Süssmayr and in spite of only part of it being Mozart's creation, it remains one of the most loved choral works in the repertoire, full of beautiful and uplifting melodies and harmonies, so typical of Mozart.

The concert also features 'I Sing and Ever Shall', an exciting choral work by the award-winning British composer Janet Wheeler. First performed in 2016, it was commissioned by our own Musical Director, David Gibson and another of his choirs, Southampton Philharmonic Choir. This work is a powerful exploration of the many aspects of singing – from the link between breath and air, words and song and the all-encompassing joy of producing music in this way. Featuring a cantata and a dance-style movement, the piece builds to a climactic concluding statement.

This promises to be an exciting concert so please come and enjoy a brand new composition together with a work of genius from the established choral repertoire.

The Church Pages

This month we celebrate Easter and we look forward to wel-

coming some of you to celebrate it with us at our services. As we approach that day, one of the things that we'll be focusing on is prayer. Hardly rocket science I hear you saying – a church focusing on prayer! But I'm gradually realising that sometimes when I'm meant to be praying I'm really just rattling off a list to God. We've been looking at Mark's gospel on Sunday mornings and here we find Jesus spending almost a whole night in prayer. I'm convinced this wasn't because he had a really long list! I think he set aside time undoubtedly to ask God for things but also merely to spend time with Him. This makes sense given our belief in a God who we can call Father. It wouldn't be much of a relationship with my Dad if all I ever communicated with Him was a list of my

own wants – it would make for a very strange one sided phonecall! But if

God is our Father then surely He wants to speak to us too.

And so in the days running up to Easter, we have our services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday in Headley as we remember the final hours of Jesus before His death on the cross. But we are also literally setting aside some space – the little vestry room in Kingsclere as a prayer room. We are going to open the prayer room from 3pm on Good Friday and it will be open until the sunrise service on Easter Sunday. This time is traditionally when we remember Jesus having died before his resurrection. The time will be split into hour slots and people can sign up for these slots. In the room will be lots of opportunity to pray and listen to what God might have to say. There will be space to read the Bible, to listen to God's word. There will be opportunity to listen to some worship music or paint. There will also be other prayer resources, like a world map, a map of the local area, and information on charities working across the world.

It would be great if you could join us. It's the testimony of Christians down the ages, and of us as a church, that when we pray, God does amazing things!


