BUY Community Priorities (summarised)

Many thanks to all of you who helped us with our recent Community Priority Survey. We received 634 replies.

Our principal focus centres on preventing the most serious types of violent offences such as those linked to knives, drugs, domestic violence, the sexual & criminal exploitation of children, & the protection of other types of vulnerable people. Managing these issues will remain a priority for all police officers.

I am concerned about the level of burglary offences, & this will be the principle area of focus for your local beat officers for the next quarter. Please continue to report all types of crime. Your local beat officers will continue to act to reduce the number of all types of offences in your local area.

Burglary update: Two burglaries were reported at Rose Hodson Court at the end of March. Nature Notes

Despite the disturbance of a complete pond renewal last September, frogs laid their spawn in early Spring and the result has been a fine crop of tadpoles. Either they are particularly bold or merely foolish, but they seem to dis-



tain the fish totally and relish fish food, especially flake. Do we have vegan fish or have they not realised that their swimming companions represent some first rate protein. Perhaps, as the fish grow their instincts will change but in the meantime it is good to see so many free swimming tadpoles.

Once more, our favourite local lakeside walk has given us cuckoo calls from its wooded fringes, this time from 360 degrees but we also had the added bonus of spotting birds as they changed their locations. Illustrations show a handsome bird with a barred body and underwings but the best description we can offer is of a grey, raptor like bird with a long tail, they don't usually pose for long.



Visiting the lake at Hosehill some weeks ago we were curious but hopeful that the blob of reddish colour atop a duck skulking under bankside branches was a red crested pochard drake, an exciting find among the usual waterfowl. It was. The bright ginger head, red beak, black chest and brown and

white body were quite unmistakeable. We were rewarded to see three drakes that day.

Eager to check if the tern raft on another lake was attracting any prospective tenants we were saddened to see a large, juvenile cormorant perched on the nest shelters and that the surrounding perimeter wire was no longer effective in deterring unwelcome visitors.

Reflections

Why does it always happen on a bank holiday? That was a thought that went through my head as I lay on the floor at-

tempting to empty the water out of a washing machine into a tiny container. It had gone wrong, showed an error code to do with a blocked waste pipe, and so I thought I'd try and clean it out. I was annoyed and a little frustrated by it – but my question of why on a bank holiday stuck with me.

It's funny because that question sort of points to a belief that there is someone scheming somewhere to make life hard. Perhaps sometimes we might think that's what God is like. But actually it's the opposite. Yes, life can still be hard, bad things happen, people hurt us, disasters and accidents happen – but we're not at the mercy of the evil in the world. God is good, outrageously good, and he actually treats us much better than we could expect.

What do I mean? Well, as Christians, we believe in something called grace. Grace is goodness undeserved and we understand God to be full of this. God created each one of us and put us in a wonderful world. Life was a gift. I didn't earn the right to live but God gave it. And God wants us to know Him and so He gives us a way to do that, through His Son, Jesus. Again, God could have just made us and then left us to our own devices but because He loves us, He wanted us to know Him, and live knowing that we have a God who loves us with an everlasting love. Jesus came to die for us, and to rise, so that we could know not only His love for us, but also His ability to save us even from death. He not only gives us life now but life which stretches beyond time, in a place which will be beyond anything we can imagine. That is God being outrageously good to us, who most of the time barely acknowledge Him.

And to tap into this goodness, all God asks of us is to accept the gift and let Him work good in us. The Bible says "If God is for us, who can be against us?" So come to Him and receive this grace, and live life gratefully to God.



Changes to St Mary's Church Interior May/June 2019

Since my last entry in the Tower the reordering team have had a long and detailed meeting to try to incorporate the suggestions and ideas that came from our open meeting on 1st April. The team have been able to include most of the ideas into one plan and we now have over 40 changes to build into the next version.

It is still going to require some careful thought as some things look good or seem the right idea until you try and fit it all into a scale plan. Then of course there are the limitations of what we can and can't do to a historic building.

Our next meeting is at the offices of our architect to go through with him those 40+ points and build them into the plan.

We have the church authorities coming to the church in July to review those latest plans and from that we will know what can go ahead.

The annual St Mary's fete is on 26th August and we plan to show off the latest drawings and ideas, which by then will be close to the final plan.

A great idea came from our last meeting. Some people were not able to come to the public meeting and so we have set up an email address where you can put forward your suggestions for the reordering team to see and consider. This will be available from June 1st through to 31st July. If you haven't had your input ,now is your chance. The next step involves more detailed technical planning to get the specifications and prepare detailed schedules in order to look for the funding and money required to carry out such a big project.

Sometimes it feels as though we are moving slowly but the important thing is, we are going forward with a clear plan.


